



Achieve these results:

Prevention:

- Be pro-active and plan ahead to prevent recurrent behavior problems

Direction:

- Educate students rather than punish students to change behaviors
- Follow specific steps to implement a "coaching for change" program
- Utilize practical techniques that are aligned with the principles of effective behavior management strategies
- Use the five stage model of a functional behavior assessment
- Differentiate behavior interventions to ensure that every student gets what he/she needs

Assessment:

- Involve students in their own assessment
- Build home-school connections that help parents provide extra support for their children
- Tools for assessing progress
- Learn how to reward successive approximations
- Find out how to assess students who have performance inconsistencies
