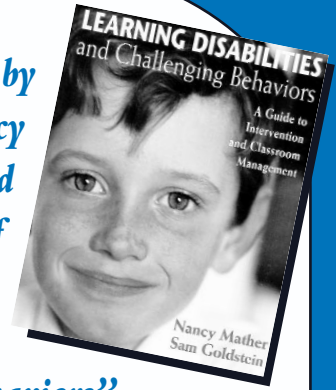

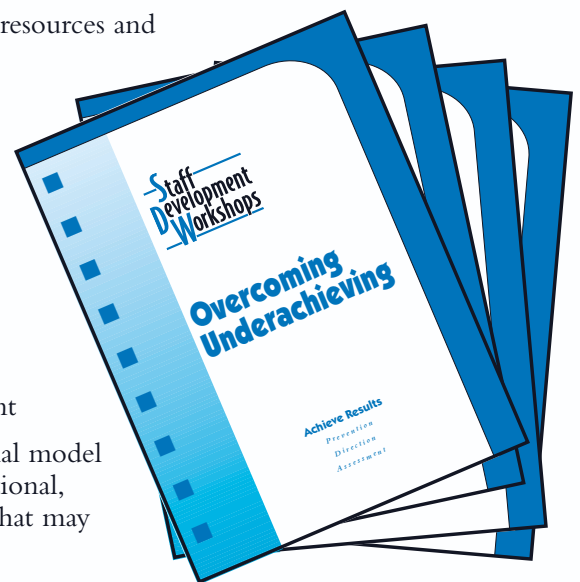

# About the presenters:

## Dr. Sam Goldstein



is a clinical neuropsychologist, a nationally certified school psychologist, and a member at the faculty at the University of Utah. He has a private practice at the Neurology Learning and Behavior Center in Salt Lake City, Utah, and is on staff at the Primary Children's Medical Center and the University Neuropsychiatric Institute. Dr. Goldstein has served as Chairman of the National Professional Advisory Board for the organization Children and Adults With Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (CHADD). He is a Senior Editor of the Journal of Attention Disorders and is on the editorial boards of four journals, including the Journal of Learning Disabilities.

Dr. Goldstein's publications include articles, guides, book chapters, and 16 texts on subjects including genetic and developmental disorders, depression, classroom consultation, brain injury, learning disability, and attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder. With Nancy Mather, Ph.D. he has completed a text for parents on children's learning problems and has completed a teacher training text for children's classroom problems. With Robert Brooks, Ph.D., he has authored the text, *Raising Resilient Children: Fostering Strength, Hope, and Optimism in Your Child*.

His award winning video tapes dealing with attention disorder, depression, and education have inspired thousands of parents and educators.

Dr. Goldstein, a knowledgeable and entertaining speaker, has lectured extensively on a national and international basis over the past twenty-one years to thousands of professionals and parents on a wide range of child development topics.

## Dr. Nancy Mather



is an Associate Professor at the University of Arizona in Tucson in the Department of Special Education, Rehabilitation, and School Psychology. She specializes in the areas of assessment, reading, writing, and learning disabilities. She received her doctorate from the University of Arizona in 1985 in learning disabilities with minor areas of study in reading and school psychology. Other professional interest include adapting special education strategies to help general education teachers accommodate student diversity.

In addition, she is a co-author of the Woodcock-Johnson III and conducts research and training in its use. She has presented widely both nationally and internationally on assessment, instruction, and issues that affect service delivery for individuals with learning disabilities. Dr. Mather has written numerous articles and

several books. She has coauthored with Dr. Sam Goldstein a book for parents entitled: *Overcoming Underachieving: An Action Guide for Helping Your Child Succeed in School* (Wiley, 1998) and a book for educators entitled: *Learning Disabilities and Challenging Behaviors: A Guide to Intervention and Classroom Management* (Paul Brookes, 2001). Most recently, she has co-authored with Dr. Lynne Jaffe, *Woodcock-Johnson III: Reports, Recommendations, and*

*Strategies*, a book designed to help educators translate assessment results into meaningful instructional plans.

Dr. Mather is renowned for her ability to present outstanding workshops for educators which focus on practical strategies that can be used the very next day.
